Class 2 Spring 2 2023 Overview

What are the features of Brazil?



This half term in French we are learning about fruit.

In this unit pupils will learn 10 fruits and attempt to spell some of these nouns with their correct article/determiner. We will learn how to name and recognise up to 10 fruits in French; attempt to spell some of these nouns; ask somebody in French if they like a particular fruit and say what fruits they like and dislike.

FRENCH

By the end of this unit, children will have delved into the vibrant world of art, acquainting themselves with a plethora of diverse artists and their distinct styles of painting. Through engaging and interactive learning experiences, they will gain insight into the lives and techniques of three profoundly different artists, each contributing to the rich tapestry of artistic expression.

With newfound knowledge and inspiration, children will embark on their own creative journeys, guided by the influences of masterful artists. They will unleash their imagination and express themselves through the creation of self-portraits, capturing their essence and unique perspectives in their sketch books.

In RE our big question for this ½ term is: Why do Christians call the day Jesus died 'Good Friday'? (Salvation)

Within this unit, pupils will learn about how the Christian Salvation story fits into the big story of the Bible. They will find out about the main events of holy week and offer suggestions about how people at the time might have felt and responded to these key events. Pupils will study texts from the Bible that retell the key events of holy week and suggest what these mean for Christians today. Later in the unit, pupils will find out about how Christians today remember, celebrate and respond to the events of holy week and Easter. They will begin to make links between some of these events and life in the world today, suggesting why some Christians live their lives in the way that they do. We will explore this through research and discussion.

In PSHE we will be thinking about 'Being Healthy'

We will examine topics such as:

- Being fit and healthy
- What do I know about drugs
- Being safe
- My friends and me
- Alcohol
- Smoking
- Group dynamics
- Healthy friendships

GEOGRAPHY

SCIENCE
