How has crime and punishment changed over time in Britain?

**History**

By the end of this enquiry pupils will be able to learn how crime and punishment has changed over time in Britain and create links with prior learning.

**Art**

By the end of this enquiry pupils will be able to use collage to make art based on a theme.

**Design and Technology**

By the end of this enquiry, pupils will be able to design, make and evaluate a pillow with an Olympic theme.

**Computing**

By the end of this enquiry, children will research and design a product that they will advertise through digital means.

**Science**

By the end of this enquiry children will learn how to: compare and group together everyday materials on the basis of their properties

**Religious Education**

By the end of this enquiry children will be able to discuss different views on the existence of God and how that affects their life.

**PHSE**

By the end of this enquiry, children will learn about their changing bodies in more detail at age related level. It will also include a talk from a school nurse.

**Physical Education**

By the end of this enquiry, children will learn about the rules, strategies and features of cricket and will be able to play competitive games

**French**

By the end of this enquiry, children will learn ten phrases for activities they may do at the weekend in French.

By the end of this enquiry, children will explore a song from India and Pakistan, including the melody, accompaniment and four-part singing in a round, creating an arrangement in the same style.
